

## **Getting to Saffron Hall**

We have over 400 free car parking spaces on site at Saffron Hall, including dedicated parking spaces for wheelchair guests and Blue Badge holders. Most of our car parks are to the rear of the building, and all are within five to 10 minutes' walk of the hall. Take a look at our map to find out exactly where parking spaces and entrances are.

We recommend you arrive at least 20 minutes before your performance starts to give you enough time to park and make your way to your seat.



#### Practicalities of the Show

- 2 hours duration including a 20 minute interval
- House lights remain on a medium setting throughout the performance.
- No strobe lighting or pyrotechnics (flashes and bangs) and fewer loud sound effects during the show
- The overall volume of the performance will be reduced.
- You are welcome to come and go as you please, the doors to the foyer will be easily accessible
- If you feel the need to leave the hall and do not want to go back in, you are welcome to watch the rest of the performance with sound in the foyer
- Limited audience participation
- No need to worry about making noise (even in the quiet bits!)
- At the end of the show and after songs, people may clap and cheer loudly. You can join in or be prepared to make individual adjustments as required e.g. noise cancelling headphones





If you or anyone you're with needs a time out, the library is a great place for you to relax. When you are ready, you may head back to the hall to watch the rest of the performance or you can watch the rest of the performance on the TV screen in the foyer.

### Meet the characters



## **Dorothy:**

A sweet, innocent young lady with a streak of boldness, outspoken and headstrong, who dearly loves her family, friends and dog, Toto. She dreams of escaping to a far-off place where she will not get into trouble.



#### Scarecrow:

The Scarecrow becomes Dorothy's good friend. He is humorous and funny and longs for a brain!



#### Tin Man:

The Tin Man has no heart but is very caring and loyal.



#### Lion:

The Lion acts tough, but his fearful self comes out in any scary situation.



# Wicked Witch of the West:

The Wicked Witch wants revenge on Dorothy. She is the villain of the story.



#### Glinda:

Glinda is the Good Witch of the North who is the mother figure for Munchkins and Dorothy whom she guides through Oz; delicate and graceful.

## The Story of The Wizard of Oz

Dorothy works on the farm with her farm hands friend Tom, Dick and Harry. Suddenly a tornado rips through the farm. Dorothy goes in search for her dog, Toto, and is whisked away in their house to the magical land of Oz.

When they arrive in Oz, they meet Glinda, the Good Witch in Munchkinland. The Munchkins and Glinda congratulate Dorothy for landing her house on the Wicked Witch of the East. In return for her good doing, Glinda awards Dorothy with the red shoes of bravery. Dorothy is desperate to get back to the farm. Glinda tells Dorothy to follow the Yellow Brick Road towards the Emerald City to meet the Wizard. He is the only one who can get Dorothy home.

On Dorothy's journey, she meets a Scarecrow that needs a brain, a Tin Man missing a heart, and a Cowardly Lion who wants courage. Dorothy asks them to come with her to meet the Wizard and see if he'll grant their wishes. Following their every move is the Wicked Witch of the West and her army of winged monkeys who are desperate to get the red shoes from Dorothy.

When they arrive at the Emerald City, the Wizard says that he will only grant their wishes if they bring back the broom of the Wicked Witch of the West.

They agree to do so, however Dorothy is captured by the Witch's winged monkeys and is trapped inside the Witch's castle. The Lion, Tin Man and Scarecrow go to save Dorothy and in doing so defeat the Wicked Witch of the West by chucking a bucket of water and melting her.

They take the broom back to The Wizard who finally grants all their wishes and sends Dorothy home.
